1. Berkeley Food Network (BFN) – Help Address Food Insecurity in the Bay Area

Did you know that 1 in 5 Berkeley residents are not able to put enough food on their tables to live healthy, hunger-free lives?

BFN was founded in December 2016 with the goal of ending hunger in Berkeley. BFN has an innovative mix of community-centered and collaborative programs to get healthy, nutritious food to the people in Berkeley who need it. At the heart of this work is BFN’s food sourcing and distribution hub operating out of its Berkeley warehouse. BFN sources food from the Alameda County Community Food Bank and local food businesses that is later distributed to Berkeley residents.

**2. Center for Youth Development through Law (CYDL)

CYDL provides transformative programs that enable high school students from first generation and marginalized backgrounds to achieve academically, pursue fulfilling careers, and participate as engaged community members and leaders. CYDL’s programs immerse youth in environments that would otherwise seem inaccessible: classes and activities on the UC Berkeley campus and professional internships in law, government and social justice organizations. These activities along with CYDL’s individualized support, social/emotional development curriculum, stipends and ongoing mentoring enable the youth to flourish in these environments, and beyond. CYDL participants also engage deeply with community issues that are relevant to their lives. More than 92% of CYDL program alumni go on to attend higher education! Many have used the program as a springboard to civic engagement and careers in community service and social justice.
